Directions to Crowne Plaza (King of Prussia)

From the Philadelphia International Airport:

Follow signs for I-95 South and follow to Exit 7 (476 North Plymouth Meeting). Follow 476 North to Exit 16B (76 West to Valley Forge). Follow 76 West to Exit 327 (Mall Blvd). Go down the ramp to the traffic light and turn left onto Mall Blvd. After the 2nd light, the hotel will be on the left.

From Pennsylvania Turnpike (East or West):

Take Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Proceed to Valley Forge Park Exit 327; merge right onto North Gulph Road. Proceed to Goddard Blvd make a right. Proceed to Mall Blvd, make a left. After the 2nd traffic light, the hotel will be on the left.

From Center City / 30th Street Station – Philadelphia:

From Route 202 North:



New technologies used in the treatment and monitoring of heart failure will also be addressed.

- ✓ Identify and examine current research regarding exercise prescription for patients with HF.
- ✓ Describe appropriate monitoring parameters for ECG, BP, HR and other signs for exercise.
- ✓ Discuss the impact anxiety and depression has on the HF patient.
- ✓ Describe how medical illiteracy must be addressed when managing patients with HF.
